Academic Activities

Dr. Liu Xiao Feng and Mr. Daniel Yeung took part in the 1996 Third Summer Senior Religion and Culture Seminar jointly organized by Department of Religious Studies and Department of Philosophy of Peking University, and ISCS from July 15 to 21. Dr. Liu gave two lectures, "Mysticism and Monasticism" and "the Society of Liberalism and Christianity" in this Seminar. The number of participants was more than a hundred. During this 7-day seminar, the students could attend the lectures as well as site visit to religious places. In addition, internationally well-known German Catholic theologian, Prof. Dr. Hans Kung, was invited by ISCS to join this seminar. Prof. Kung presented his "Global Ethics." After the seminar, we arranged his meeting with professors and scholars of Peking University, Renmin University of China and the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences.

On September 23, Dr. Liu Xiao Feng and Mr. Daniel Yeung visited Christian Culture Institute at Fudan University in Shanghai. Dr. Liu presented his paper "Individuality between National Authority and Social Interest." There was an audience of more than a hundred and their response was very heated. After lecture, Dr. Liu and Mr. Yeung met with Prof. Zhang Qing Xiong, the Dean of Christian Culture Institute and Prof. Yin Da Yi, famous scholar of Christian philosophy to discuss further cooperation.
