Renman University and the title of his dissertation is "The Logic of History in New Testament." The main purpose of his visit is to collect materials for his research entitled "Christology in the Synoptic Gospels."

A Visiting Scholar's Report by **Professor CHOONG Chee Pang,** Academic Consultant of the Lutheran World Federation (Geneva), Visiting Professor of Peking and Fudan Universities

Visiting Period: 19 December 2004 to 8 February 2005

First of all I wish to take this opportunity to express my profound gratitude to the ISCS, and especially to Mr. Yeung, the Executive Director, for giving me the wonderful opportunity to be a visiting scholar at the Institute from 19 December 2004 to 8 February 2005. I am also indebted to the academic and office staff of the Institute for their kind hospitality and fellowship throughout my entire stay here. The whole environment of the Institute coupled with excellent library of the nearby Lutheran Theological Seminary are most conducive for writing and reflection. My only regret is that my residence here this time is not long enough for more serious work. I can only look forward to another opportunity to do so. As one who has been deeply involved in Christian studies in the Chinese academia since 1988, I believe I have already been treated more or less like an ordinary mainland scholar, and I am certainly very grateful for such generous treatment. Since my stay here is relatively short I could only focus on the following two writing projects.

1. A book on the Basic Elements of New Testament Greek for Chinese Students.

Having taught NT Greek as a very short course in both Peking and Fudan Universities, the thought about writing a simple grammar book for Chinese students has been with me for quite sometime now. There are obviously quite a number of good grammar books already in the market in both English and Chinese. However, these are largely meant for theological students and the course usually takes about one academic year, or about eight months to complete. This is unfortunately not quite possible for average Chinese courses. As such, a much simpler and far less ambitious Greek course has to be designed for the Chinese student. Having consulted an experience teacher who has taught intensive New Testament Greek in a well known British university, I have decided to produce a modest grammar book which could be completed in about three months by the format of this writing project which will lead to the actual writing up of the lessons. This will obviously take a much longer period of time to accomplish.

2. A paper on Christian Studies in the Chinese Academia

I have been approached by a British publisher to write a paper on the subject. In order not to repeat what I have presented in an international conference in the Chinese University of Hong Kong in September-October, 2004, I have given a tentative title

to the new paper: "Studying Christianity and Doing Theology extra ecclesiam." One of the unique features of current Christian studies in China is that it is largely done by scholars who are extra ecclesiam (outside the Church). I have managed to gather some useful materials in Beijing and here in the last few weeks for the paper.

Concluding Remarks

The value of my residence at the ISCS is not limited to a couple of writing projects. The interaction with other scholars in the ISCS as well as in other academic institutions in Hong Kong has also been most valuable. The stay here has also enabled me to observe first hand the *modus operandi* of the ISCS. I have been very much impressed by the strategic network that the Institute has established and the excellent work it has been doing, especially in the promotion of Christian studies in China and Sino theology internationally. May the Lord continue to honour and bless its ongoing mission. Amen!
